

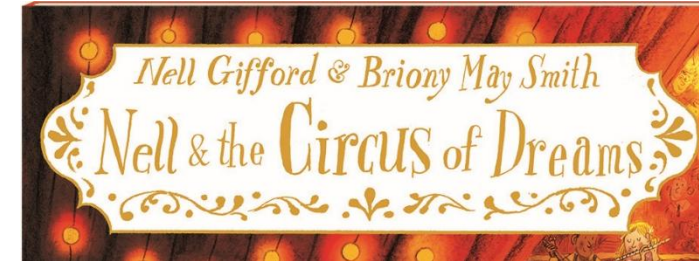
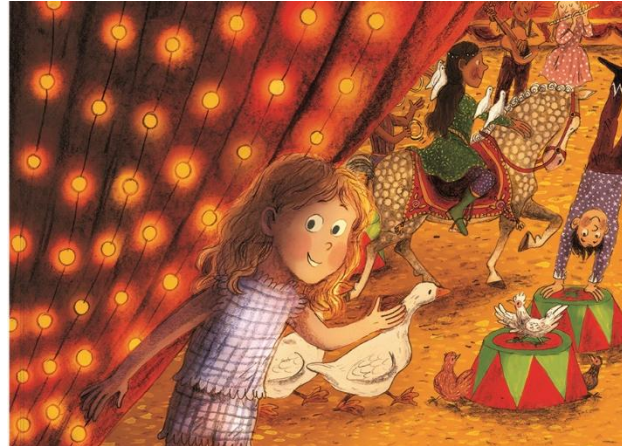


Literacy knowledge organisers: Stories from other cultures. (Nell & the circus of dreams)



Key vocabulary:

- Noun – a person, place or object.
- Adjective – a describing word
- Plot - the **order of events** — what happens **first, next, and last.**
- **Circus** –A fun show with people and animals doing tricks that usually happens in a big tent.
- **Performer** – A person who does tricks or acts in the circus.
- **Juggling** – A person who throws and catches things like balls or clubs
- **Ringmaster** – The person in charge of the show and talks to the crowd
- **Acrobat** – A person who jumps, flips, and balances high in the air.
- **Trapeze** – A swing high in the air where people fly and catch each other.
