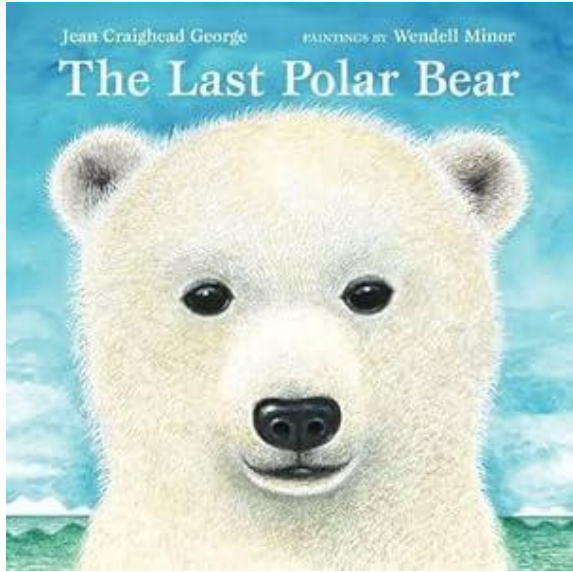


The Lost Polar Bear

| Word | Definition |
|----------|---|
| ice floe | A large flat piece of ice that floats on the sea. |
| Climate | The usual kind of weather a place has over a long time. |
| Thaw | When ice or snow melts and turns into water. |
| Flailed | Moved around wildly, like arms waving in all directions |
| Squall | A sudden, strong burst of wind, often with rain or snow. |
| Nanuq | A word from the Inuit language meaning “polar bear.” |
| Subzero | Very, very cold—below freezing (colder than 0°C). |
| warming | Getting hotter; when something (like the earth) becomes warmer. |
