Our school day

Start of the day

Gates open 8:50am Gates closed 9:00am

School start time 9:00am (the children need to be in class ready for the register by this time)

End of the day

Gates open 3:20pm

School finish time 3:30pm

All children will be dropped off at their classroom door and collected from the same door.

As we get to know you, your child's teacher will ask you to provide a collection password.

For your child's safety, they will only be released to individuals you have nominated and given permission to collect them. You will have already provided these names on the school's online admission form.

Wraparound care is provided by our own qualified staff. They are based mainly in the hall, sometimes in a classroom if an afterschool sports club is running in the hall.

You will have received a wraparound care contract. Please take some time to read through the terms and conditions and then sign it to confirm that you understand and are happy to agree to them. Once completed, please return the contract to the school office.

The contract must be in place before your child attends any session.

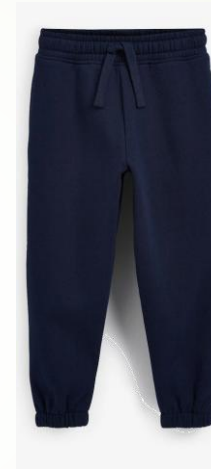

What else will my child need?

Here is what your child will need.

- The correct uniform
- PE kit on active/PE days (we will tell you the days nearer the time)
- A coat
- A book bag
- A water bottle
- If having a packed lunch, a lunch box which is:
 - Named
 - Standard size



As you can imagine things can sometimes be misplaced. To help us return them to their owner, please name everything that your child has at school with them. This includes uniform, drinks bottle and coats.

Sickness

What do I do if my child is off sick?

To report an absence, please telephone the school office by **8:30am** at the latest.

When you call, please select option 1 and leave a message with the relevant details.

If your child's attendance falls below what we would usually expect, we will work in partnership with you to offer support and help to improve this wherever possible.

We kindly ask that children arrive on time each day, as persistent lateness may need to be recorded as an unauthorised absence.





Injury and illness

It is important that you inform us if you child has any condition that may affect them during their time in school. This will require school to write a medical plan.

The school is staffed by first aiders, and we have paediatric first aiders in EYFS. If your child is feeling unwell during the school day they will be treated by an adult. Your child may be taken to the office if they are feeling too unwell and we will contact you if we feel they are too ill to remain at school.

Parents will be contacted if your child sustains a serious injury at school.



Medical / health condition

We can administer prescribed medicines in school.

To do this, you will need to complete a consent form (available from the school office) and hand your child's medication directly to a member of the office team in a clearly labelled bag.

Medicines should not be sent into school in your child's bag.

Where possible, we kindly ask that antibiotic doses are given before and after the school day.



Lunch and Snack

A free healthy and delicious lunch is provided for children in reception, with a choice of a meat or vegetarian option.

Please ensure you have informed us if your child has any allergies or dietary needs (including religious dietary needs).



Oak Grange Primary School is a NUT
FREE school.

Children in EFFT and KS1 are all provided with a free piece of fruit each day as a healthy snack.

Please ensure that your child only has **water** in their water bottle. Thank you

If you want to send your child with a healthy packed lunch, then that is also an option. Children will eat this in the hall with their friends.

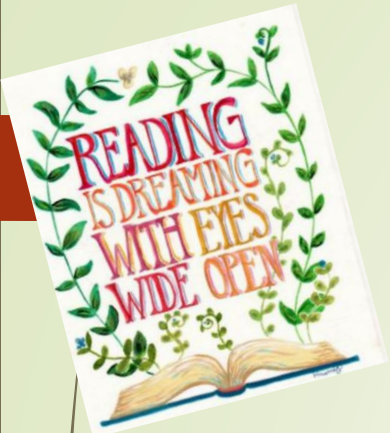

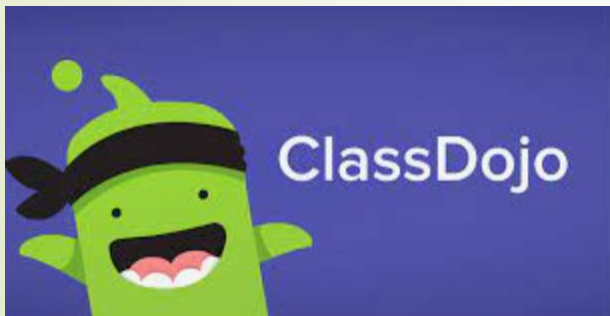


Communication with school
